



The new Goodale Street Garage, designed for the Franklin County Convention Authority, is an example of sustainable innovation. The 750-space Ohio garage is situated across the street from the north façade of the Columbus Convention Center.

The garage will fulfill the immediate need of both convention center patrons and visitors to the ever-densifying Short North, an arts district.

Design Reflects Highly Visible Location

The design capitalizes on both the complexity of the site—high visibility adjacent to the highway, proximity to the Short North, the convention center to the south, downtown views—and high aspirations of the owner.
